

A Blonde Professional Golfer in Korea?

A blonde former model from America is challenging the KLPGA.

Carrie Vaughan (age 30) is going to participate in a qualifying tournament for the KLPGA Dream Tour from July 25-27 at the Sun Hill Golf Club (par 72 - 6,189 yards) in Ga-pyung announced the KLPGA.

If successful, Vaughan will qualify for the 2006 KLPGA Dream Tour and will compete in a qualifying tournament for the KLPGA Tour from October 10-12 at the Phoenix Park Golf Club.

“I want to have the opportunity to learn from Korean coaches who have developed many of the current Korean players on the LPGA. They are obviously very good,” said Vaughan.

She is currently represented by Asia Sports & Entertainment (ASE), and it seems that Vaughan would like to use this experience in Korea to play here and in other countries throughout Asia.

However, Vaughan’s golf skill is still unknown at this time. She started playing golf at a young age, and after entering Seattle Preparatory School, she won the Seattle city’s High School Individual Golf Championship for three years in a row, and finished 2nd in the Washington State Tournament. During her college years at the University of Southern California (USC), she had the opportunity to play in the prestigious “Topy Cup” in Japan, where she did a magnificent job helping the team finished in 2nd place. Upon graduation from USC, Vaughan dabbled modeling and successfully worked in medical sales.
