Vaughan is going to compete in a tournament for KLPGA Dream Tour from July 25-27 at the Sun Hill Golf Club. “She will be the first American to be a member of the KLPGA if she qualifies,” said a KLPGA staff member.

Vaughan started golf from a young age and after entering Seattle Preparatory School, she won Seattle city’s High School Individual Golf Champion for three years and finished 2nd in the Washington State Tournament. During the college at the University of Southern California (USC), she had an opportunity to play in the prestigious “Topy Cup” in Japan, where she did a magnificent job helping the team finished in 2nd place. Upon graduation from university, she dabbled modeling and successfully worked in medical sales.

Vaughn’s passion for golf never faded. Currently, Vaughan is teaching kids at the Big Canyon County Club in Newport Beach. If Vaughan qualifies, she will have a chance to play at the KLPGA Qualifying Tour from October 10-12 at the Phoenix Park Golf Club.
